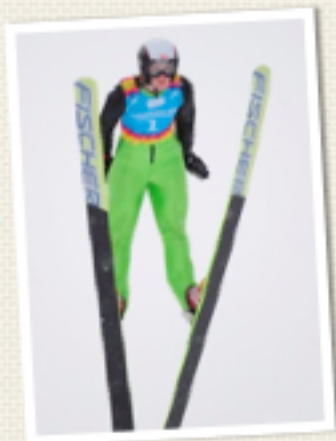

Canada brings home Bronze medal & Alberta's Taylor Henrich makes ski jumping history at Winter Youth Olympics, Innsbruck, Austria



Calgary's Taylor Henrich made history at the World Youth Olympics becoming the first Canadian woman to compete in an Olympic ski jumping competition.

"It's an honor," said Henrich in a statement. "I am so excited that I got to be the first (Canadian woman)." Henrich was fifth with a total score of 204.6, behind Lea Lemare of France who totaled 226.01. Women's ski jumping fought an unsuccessful legal battle for inclusion at the 2010 Vancouver Olympics, but is part of the Innsbruck program after being approved for the 2014 Sochi Games.



The Canadian Team—consisting of female special jumper Taylor Henrich, male special jumper Dusty Korek & Nordic Combined skier Nathaniel Mah—manage overcame inconsistent conditions to secure a historic Bronze medal. All Three Athletes train at Canada Olympic Park, Calgary Alberta.
