



Annual Fee Policy

Alberta Ski Jumping and Nordic Combined

1.0 Annual Fee

The annual dues for athlete members of ASJNC are set for the year running from July 1, 2015 to March 31, 2016, according to the following schedule:

- * Club Elite: \$4,100 or \$1,025/quarter (\$4,200 starting October, 2015 or \$1,050 /quarter)
- * Provincial Development: \$4,100 or \$1,025/quarter (\$4,200 starting October, 2015 or \$1,050/quarter)
- * Provincial Team: \$4,400 or \$1,100/quarter (\$4,500 starting October, 2015 or \$1,125/quarter)

Fees will be reviewed annually prior to the ASJNC AGM. Annual adjustments will be made from October 2015 onward to reflect, at a minimum, the cost of inflation based on the Alberta Consumer Price Index (CPI).

These dues are payable in quarterly installments as invoiced with 4 post-dated cheques dated April 1st, July 6th, October 5th and January 4th. Cheques are due upon receipt of the invoice. Annual dues may be increased from year to year and will be announced at the ASJNC AGM each year.

Even though dues are paid quarterly, an athlete remains responsible for the full annual fee unless the provisions of the cancellation clause (2.0) are met.

2.0 Cancellation

Portions of the annual fee may be refunded, or future portions may not be invoiced, if the athlete submits notice, in writing, to the ASJNC chairperson no less than 30 days prior to the beginning of the next invoice period as described in section 1.0.

3.0 Reinstatement

Athletes who have previously left ASJNC may be readmitted to the program. A recommendation from the ASJNC head coach is required. Advance payment for one year will be required, either as a lump sum or in the form of 4 post-dated cheques.

Newly readmitted athletes will initially be placed into the Club Elite level, and will be required to qualify any advancement within the ASJNC tiers.

4.0 Special Circumstances

Athletes with special circumstances may appeal any of the above provisions to the ASJNC chairperson. All exceptions will require ASJNC chair approval.
